

# Sport Premium Grant 2017-18

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

Historically each school received approximately £8,000 plus an extra £5.00 per pupil each year.

In this academic year (2017-18) this figure has increased. This amount a school received is based on the number of pupils in the school in Years 1-6 from our January census.

Whitnash is eligible for £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per child. However for this academic year the school will only receive 7/12ths of the funding for this financial year, as the decision to increase the funding has come part way through this financial year.

## Purpose of funding

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

The Department for Education advise that Sports Premium can be used for the following:

- Develop and add to the PE and sports activities that your school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
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There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvements across:

1. The engagement of pupils in regular physical activity (30 minutes of physical activity per day)
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sports
