



Reception Home Learning- Autumn 2

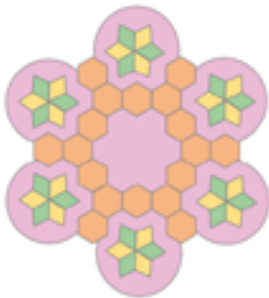


This half term we will be learning about Diwali and Bonfire Night. We will be reading the 'Grandma's Magic Blanket' Christmas story written by our resident author Miss Hall, as well as preparing for Christmas. Please spend some time discussing the following activities with your child. All of the activities are linked to the topics we will be learning about in school.

Please choose **at least 4 activities** to complete together over the course of the half term and return your completed home learning recorded in your child's learning log by **Monday 13th December.**

We have been learning about circles, triangles and other 2D shapes.

Can you create your own Diwali rangoli pattern using different shapes?



Practise your careful counting at home. Ask your adult to say a number and you can go and count the corresponding number of objects. You can choose anything to count from around your home.

Can you write the number?
What is 1 more/1 less than the number of objects you found?
Choose how you would like to record this e.g. pencil & paper, photo.

We will be reading the 'Grandma's Magic Blanket' Christmas story.

Can you draw a picture of a place that Daisy might visit on her magic blanket? Use your imaginations it can be anywhere!

Can you label or write a sentence about your picture?



Can you create a calendar with a countdown to Christmas?

How many sleeps?

How many school days?

Which days do we come to school which days are we at home?



Watch some fireworks together from your window or online. Paint or draw a firework picture.

You can use crayons, paints, pens or even glitter glue. Talk about what you liked or disliked, the shapes and colours you saw and the sounds you heard.

Can you write any words to describe the fireworks or the sounds that they made?

Go on a number hunt around your home and/or a walk with an adult.

Can you spot the numbers 1-10?

You might be able to identify some larger numbers?

Did you find the same number(s) in different places?

Encourage your child to talk about the numbers they see and record their findings by drawing pictures or taking photos of the numbers they find.
