

# Sport Premium Grant 2020-21

The government is continuing to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

Whitnash will receive approximately £18,460.00 in 2020-21 from the Sports Premium Grant.

The school is carrying forward on outstanding £12,148.00, which was allocated in the in the previous financial year and not spent. This means that the total fund for expenditure this year is; **£30,192.00**

## Purpose of funding

The primary PE and sport premium was introduced in March 2013 to improve the provision of physical education and school sport in primary schools across England. The funding is allocated directly to primary schools and is ring-fenced. This means it may only be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.
